

SPRING MEET RULES DISTRICT 26AA
July 29, 2004 2004-2005 & 2005-2006

Eligibility Rules: The following eligibility rules shall apply to track, golf, and tennis competition held by the University Interscholastic League District 26AA where they do not conflict with the UIL Constitution and Contest Rules:

- Eligibility will be determined by age for all divisions.
- Seventh Grade students must not be fourteen (14) years of age on or before September 1, 2005.
- Eighth Grade students must not be fifteen (15) years of age on or before September 1, 2005.
- Junior Varsity students must be no higher than the eleventh grade and have at least one-year eligibility remaining on or before September 1, 2005.
- Students too old for their grade may compete in the next higher age group.
- Sign-up for the seventh grade, eighth grade, and junior varsity on the day of the event.

- District 26AA Passes will be honored at all events.
- An accounting and a check for all gate receipts shall be mailed to the Spring Meet Director.
 - All bills, paid receipts, etc., shall be mailed to the Spring Meet Director for reimbursement to the individual, school, or business.
 - After the Spring Meet is concluded, the Spring Meet Director shall either prorate excess district funds or prorate the excess cost of operation to each member school. Each member school shall reimburse the Spring Meet Director its share of excess cost of operation no later than June 1, 2006.

General Rules, Regulations, and Information (Varsity):

- Double representation in literary events will be allowed subject to the UIL Constitution and Contest Rules.
- Starting time for all events shall be no earlier than 8:00 A.M.
- All tourney or meet events where applicable shall be seeded by the coaches or sponsors.
- Ten (10) days prior to an event a certified entry shall be sent to both the Spring Meet Director and to the Contest Director. A certified eligibility list is sent to the Spring Meet Director and State UIL prior to competing in any invitational meet.
 - Students who are not eligible at ten days prior to the meet but may become eligible at the time of the scheduled district meet may be listed on the entry form and assigned to events. They must be eligible at the time they actually compete.
 - Students entered but who have lost their eligibility because of the academic regulations shall be permitted to be dropped or scratched.
 - Other eligible participants shall be permitted to be added to the vacated places. These substitutes shall be on an eligibility form postmarked no later than the day of the meet.
 - If a school which has not entered an event ten (10) days prior wishes to enter an event at the time of the scratch meeting, its entries will not be allowed.
 - The organizational meeting for track will be held 5 to 7 days before the District Track Meet. Any event left blank at the close of this organizational meeting may **not** be filled at the scratch meeting the day of the meet. At the scratch meeting the day of the meet; substitutions may be made if the substitute has been previously listed on UIL eligibility form submitted to the District Chair.
- Wharton County Junior College may host the academic events and furnish judges for the various events. District 26AA will furnish judges for the academic meet to be chosen from surrounding school districts when possible or, if necessary, from area colleges. In the event selected judges are not W.C.J.C. staff personnel, District 26AA, District 30AA, or District 25AAA personnel, judging fees (\$25/round for C-X and LD, \$20/round for other speech events) and mileage at the federal reimbursement rate will be paid by the district.
- Each member school shall provide two school workers for each Spring Meet event when needed or requested.
- The Spring Meet Director shall always send each executive member a copy of all transfer approval statements.
- The scoring in Boys and Girls Golf shall be limited to nine (9) strokes per hole at the district meet. In case of a tie in team or medalist position, a Sudden Death play-off will be used starting at the first hole, with no stroke limit to determine winner(s).
- Rules for golf, tennis, and track are in the 05-06 Constitution and Contest Rules, 05-06 UIL sports publications, and the rulebooks for each sport published by the National Federation of State High School Associations.

Awards: All awards (plaques, medals, ribbons, etc.) will be purchased and made available to all division directors by the Spring Meet Director. An all-round championship plaque (11x14") based on points earned at the varsity level shall be awarded two weeks after the final Spring Meet competition.

Track/Field:

- A team plaque will be awarded to the winner of each track and field division, 9"x12" varsity, 8"x10" junior varsity, 7"x9" seventh and eighth grades.
- Varsity individual winners will be awarded gold, silver, and bronze 2" custom UIL medal with RWB drape ribbon and box for the first three places, 1 1/2" bronze stock UIL medals with RWB drape ribbons and presentation boxes for the last three places.
- Junior varsity individual winners will be awarded gold, silver, and bronze 1 1/2" stock UIL medals with RWB drape ribbons and presentation boxes for the first three places, and ribbons for the 4th, 5th, and 6th places.

4. Seventh /eighth grade individual winners will be awarded ribbons for the first 6 places for each event. If Zoned, a set of ribbons for the North Zone and a set for the South Zone. Seventh/eighth grade individual winners will be awarded gold, silver, and bronze 1 1/2" stock UIL medals with RWB drape ribbons for the first three places and bronze 11/8" medals for 4th, 5th, and 6th place in the Jr. High District Track Meet.

One-Act Play:

1. Two (2) 9"x12" winning play plaques (engraved: Advancing One-Act Play 2006 will be awarded.
2. One (1) 8"x10" alternate play plaque (engraved: One-Act Play Alternate 2006) will be awarded.
3. Number of 2" silver All-star cast medals to be determined by the Critic Judge (engraved: District 26AA All-Star Cast 2006) will be awarded.
4. Number of 2" bronze honorable mention all-star cast medals to be determined by the Critic Judge (engraved: District 26AA Honorable Mention All-Star Cast 2006) will be awarded.
5. One (1) 2" gold best actor medal (engraved: District 26AA Best Actor 2006) will be awarded.
6. One (1) 2" gold best actress medal (engraved: District 26AA Best Actress 2006) will be awarded.
7. Number of 2" gold medals to be awarded will be determined by the number of students in the two advancing plays cast and crew (engraved: Advancing One-Act Play District 26AA 2006).
8. Same above awards will be provided for Zone I and Zone II with the appropriate engraving for the advancing plaques being 8"x10", the alternate plaques being 5"x7", and the medals will be 1 1/2 inches.

Tennis:

1. A team plaque will be awarded to the winner of the boys and girls varsity divisions and the boys and girls junior varsity division, 9"x12" varsity, 8"x10" junior varsity (four (4) plaques).
2. Varsity single and doubles winners will be awarded 2" gold, silver, and bronze custom medals for the first three places and 1 1/2" bronze stock medals will be awarded to the fourth place.
3. Junior varsity singles and doubles winners will be awarded gold, silver, and bronze 1 1/2" stock medals for the first three places and ribbons for fourth place.

Golf:

1. A team plaque 9"x12" will be awarded to the winner of the boys and girls varsity division (2 plaques).
2. Varsity team members will be awarded 2" gold, silver, and bronze custom medals for the first three place teams.
3. A plaque (5"x7") will be awarded the first medalist of each division (2 players). 2" silver and bronze custom medals will be awarded for the second and third medalist for each division.

Academics:

1. A plaque (9"x11") will be awarded to the winner of the varsity academic meet.
2. Varsity individual winners will be awarded 2" custom gold, silver, and bronze medals for the first three places and 1 1/2" bronze stock medals will be awarded for the next three places. 1st place team members will receive 2" custom gold medals, 2nd place team members will receive 2" custom silver medals.
3. A 5" x 7" plaque will be given to the Overall Journalism Team and to the Overall Speech Team.
3. There will be three divisions: 2-5, 6, 7/8 for the elementary and Junior High Academic meet. Each group will have a first and runner-up plaque. Gold silver, and bronze 1 1/8" stock UIL medals with RWB drape ribbons for the first three places and ribbons for the last three places will be awarded. All participants will receive a ribbon. A set of awards for Zone I and a set for the Zone II will be awarded if Zones are formed.

Spring Meet Champion:

1. A plaque (11"x14") will be awarded to the winner of the Spring Meet engraved: Spring Meet Champion 2006.

Cross Country

1. Varsity Individual will be awarded 2" custom gold, silver, and bronze medals for the first three places and 1 1/2" bronze stock medals for 4th to 10th place. 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place teams receive 7 (2") gold, silver, and bronze medals.
2. JV, same as above except 1 1/2" medals and ribbons for 4th, 5th, and 6th place.
