1. ADMISSION CHARGES

Adults \$2.00

Students \$1.00

2. OFFICIALS

There must be two (2) TASO officials for varsity games and no official shall call more than two games. It is recommended that three (3) officials be used for three games. All Head Basketball Coaches will send to every other district Head Basketball Coach a scratch list of officials they do not wish to use for the district basketball season. The list must be received by the 1st Monday in December. If no list is received by that date from a particular school, the Head Basketball Coach (or Athletic Director) of the requesting school will notify the Athletic Director of the school who has not sent the list and request that list immediately. Notification of any change in officials should be made as soon as possible prior to the day of the game.

In case no officials or incomplete crew, arrive to officiate a district game, the coaches of the teams involved must agree on the officials to be used, or the game must be made up on the following Saturday night (the same week) at the original visitor's site -- new home team will secure and pay officials and retain all gate money. TASO or associate officials shall be used for sub-varsity games.

3. DISTRICT PLAY: GIRLS

Teams will play each other twice, playing on Tuesday and Friday nights.

4. DISTRICT PLAY: BOYS

Teams will play each other twice; playing on Tuesday and Friday nights.

5. NOTIFICATION TO BASKETBALL CHAIRMAN

The home team must notify the Basketball District Chairman if a game is changed.

6. GIRLS' SCHEDULE MESH WITH BOYS'

On three-game nights, junior varsity games will start at 5:00 P.M. with the girl's varsity and boy's varsity to follow. Games follow back to back with approximate 12 minutes warm up time between games.

On two-game nights, the junior varsity will start at 5:00 P.M. with the varsity to follow.

The junior varsity will play six (6) minute quarters on the nights there are three or four games and eight (8) minute quarters on the nights there are two games.

Coaches will exchange schedules prior to the start of the season.

7. JUNIOR VARSITY BOYS AND GIRLS MESH WITH VARSITY

Once the boys and girls schedule mesh, for the first round of district play, the girl's junior varsity will play games in the same gym as the varsity. For the second round of district play, the boy's junior varsity will play games in the same gym as the varsity. Freshman games (if schools field a freshman team) will be played in the auxiliary gym for both rounds of district. An exception to the freshman rule would occur if the playing date is a girl's only or boy's only playing date, in which case all 3 games (freshman, JV and varsity) can be accommodated in the varsity gym. Schools with more than one gym may **(optional)** schedule the other junior varsity and the two (2) freshmen teams in the other gym on the same night.

8. DISTRICT GAME RESULTS

The **HOME TEAM** will report game results to the Basketball District Chairman after each game, by noon, the next school day. Email wstidevent@bolingisd.net or FAX # 979-657-3265. Please use district form. Executive Secretary will email results of the games to the Executive Committee, Principals and Athletic Directors.

9. CLOCK KEEPERS AND OFFICIAL SCORE KEEPERS

The clock keepers and official score keepers for District varsity games must be adults (out of high school).

10. GAME BALL

The game ball for boys and girls will be an approved regulation basketball.

11. JERSEYS

Home teams shall wear white jerseys.

12. ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

During the first week after District competition has been completed, the coach of the District Champion will be responsible for calling a meeting of the varsity basketball coaches who will select players for the All-District team. Results of the All-District selections are to be sealed and kept by the district school's coach until after both teams representing the district are out of the play-offs. The meeting time will be scheduled after regular school hours in the evening.

12A. ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM

Student shall have an overall 90 or better average by the student athlete during one grading period that falls within the confines of the district schedule. In the event more than one grade period falls within these parameters, the head coach will use his or her own judgment to determine which grading period will be used.

13. DISTRICT FEE/TROPHY

No district fee will be assessed and no championship trophy will be given. The District Champion is authorized to purchase its own trophy.

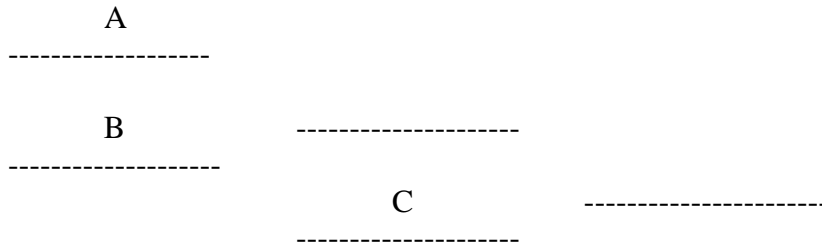
14. DETERMINING THE DISTRICT WINNER AND RUNNER-UP

- A. The team with the highest won-lost percentage shall be the District Champion. The team with the second highest won-lost percentage shall be the District Runner-up.

In case of a tie for second place, the Runner-up team will be determined in the same manner as the first place team.

- B. In the event that two teams tie, both teams will be declared CO-Champs. If one team has defeated the other twice in district games, this team will be named District Champion with the other team as District Runner-Up. If the two teams involved in the tie split their head-on contests then a one game playoff will be played. (By mutual agreement, schools may flip a coin to determine the spot for the UIL playoffs)

- C. If three teams are tied, a tournament will be held at a site chosen by the teams involved. Teams will draw for positions. The team that wins the tournament will be declared Champion.



If “A” or “B” is declared champion, then the loser between “A” and “B” will play “C” to determine runner-up in the district. If “C” wins tournament, the loser to team “C” will be declared runner-up.

- D. If four teams are tied, a single elimination tournament will be held at a site chosen by the teams involved. Teams will draw for position. The winner of the final game of the tournament will be declared District Champion and the loser will be declared the runner-up for the District.

15. JUNIOR HIGH – MIDDLE SCHOOL

For junior high basketball, there will be double round robin of games. Same numbers used for the varsity football draw will be used to develop a boy’s and girl’s schedule for 2006-2007 and 2007-2008.

- 1. Starting times: 5:00 P.M. 1st game
 6:00 P.M. 2nd game

Coaches may officiate to get games started on time.

- 2. Length of games: 7th grade - A team - 6 minutes
 8th grade - A team - 6 minutes

7th & 8th grade B team games will play 6-minute quarters with a one (1) minute half time. In the B team games, the clock will not stop except during the last 15 seconds of *each* quarter.

3. Sequence of games shall be 7B, 8B, 7A, and 8A. If a school does not have all of these teams, keep the same sequence and drop the team that is missing out of the sequence. Coaches need to communicate with each other so the schedules can reflect the number of teams each school will play on a given date.

16. SECURITY

There must be one uniformed security guard at each Varsity game. Limit interaction at the end of a game.

17. OFFICIALS NOT SHOWING UP ON TIME TO BEGIN SUB-VARSITY GAMES

Games need to start on time. If officials do not show up, coaches may fill-in.

18. MUSIC LEVEL

Each school will control the volume and content lyrics of the music being played as determined by the administrator in charge. Visiting teams do not bring music for warm up.

19. FILMS/TAPES AFTER DISTRICT PLAY

Schools will not share films or tapes in any manner after district play with any other teams except by consent of the teams involved in the playoffs.

20. VARSITY BASKETBALL SCHEDULE

Use the round robin scheduling formula. District 27 AA Varsity Basketball Schedule is attached for 2006-2007. Flip sites and change dates for 2007-2008.
